When the Huntington Beach City Council majority voted to explore outsourcing City library jobs and services earlier this year, Council members Rhonda Bolton, Dan Kalmick and Natalie Moser stood with workers. A tireless outpouring of community, resident, and worker support—paired with the efforts of these council members—brought enough awareness to the situation that the bidding company was pressured into pulling their proposal off the table. Re-electing Council members Bolton, Kalmick and Moser is a top priority in Huntington Beach, not only to preserve worker-friendly voices on the dais, but to give the residents a chance to flip the majority—and restore the City’s reputation—in a future election cycle.

YES ON MEASURE Z IN THE CITY OF ORANGE

Measure Z would generate approximately \$19 million annually if passed by raising the local Orange City sales tax from 7.75% to 8.25%—an additional half-cent for every \$1 spent in Orange on qualifying purchases. Currently, the City of Orange faces a \$19 million budget shortfall that is estimated to reach \$26 million within 5 years. Approval of Measure Z would help to preserve City services and good union jobs in the fields of community programs and events, libraries, youth and senior services, street repairs, parks, police, fire and more. If voted down, the City of Orange estimates running out of reserve funding in 18 to 24 months.
